

**DOUBT AS TO PROCEDURE:      RULE 3-3**

If at anytime during the play of any hole you find your ball in a position on the course where you are not certain what the Rules of Golf allow you to do – and there is no official available to assist you – Rule 3-3 allows you to play a second ball.

**HOWEVER YOU MUST FOLLOW THIS PROCEDURE**

1.      **BEFORE YOU DO ANYTHING** – notify the players in your group that you intend play a second ball under Rule 3-3 and which ball you want to score with if the Rules allow.
  
2.      Drop or place (whichever is applicable) the second ball. You may then play either your original ball or your second ball first. You must play both balls until each is holed out. If you fail to follow this procedure, the score you make with your original ball, or if your original ball is not one of the balls being played, the first ball put into play counts, provided it has been played in accordance with the Rules. Otherwise, the score with the other ball counts, if the Rules allow the procedure adopted for that ball.
  
3.      You must record the score you make with each ball. **YOU MUST report the facts of the situation to the Committee before you turn in your score even if you score the same with both balls. If you fail to do so, you will be DISQUALIFIED.**
  
4.      The Tournament Committee will determine your score for the hole, and if the Rules of Golf allow, the score with the ball you selected will be your score for the hole.
